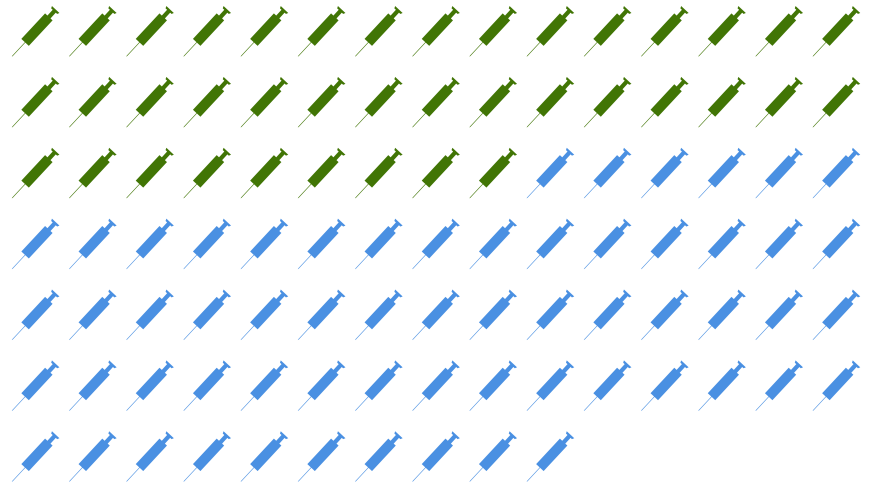

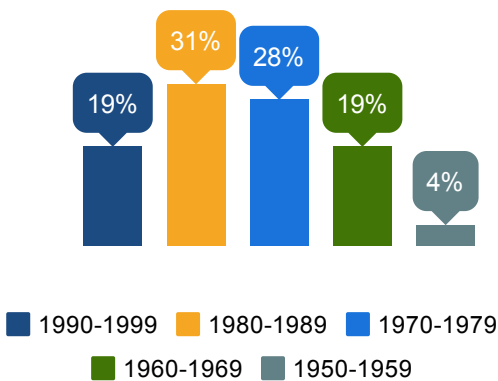

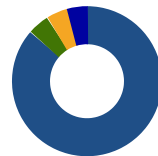

Participant Age Range

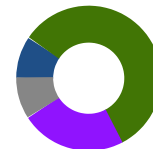
